






### Institutional strengthening and Capacity Building



Over the years, the development discourse has increasingly focused on improving access to goods and services, enhancing livelihoods, and promoting economic development. Sound institutional and organizational analysis is crucial for designing and implementing development projects, informing policy dialogue, and coordinating regional development efforts. The legal and regulatory environment in which governments

and institutions operate is central to development. We collaborate with governments, donors, development partners, civil society, the private sector, and citizens to enhance transparent institutions, implement sound development policies, and promote good governance. Working with our clients, we support institutions in building capacities for self-reliance, focusing on effective service delivery and driving meaningful change.





### Local Governance and Citizen's engagement

While applying Rights-Based Approach (RBA) as a foundation, our work on local governance in the region focuses on supporting locally led and locally- owned peacebuilding and state building efforts. highlight the importance strengthening accountability between rights-holders and duty-bearers and emphasizing the importance of locallyled and locally owned processes. We aim to strengthen local governance structures for more accountable and inclusive governments at all levels and promote women's participation in political and decision-making processes. governance programs encompass a wide range of services including electoral support, participatory governance and civic education, access to justice, conflict resolution and Preventing/Countering Violent Extremism (P/CVE) activities.



### Public financial governance

Cognizant of the nascent administrations in the region coupled with fragility, public financial management (PFM) is a core element of state building. Effective ways of managing public resources are a crucial part of public service delivery and demonstrating that the needs of the citizens are being taken care of. We provide advice and technical assistance in developing sound PFM laws and regulations, processes, and systems. Our goal is to support governments in increasing domestic revenue, promote transparency and accountability in public expenditure, equity, fiscal discipline and efficiency in the management and use of public resources for improved service delivery and economic development. # Economic Growth and Resilience

### Resilience Programs

High poverty rates and recurrent shocks are driving many people in the Horn of Africa into crisis year after year, resulting in human suffering, loss of life and livelihoods. Experience has shown us that each dollar spent on resilience yields nearly three dollars in development benefits and reduced humanitarian spending. HACOF is at the part of global movement along with donors to build resilience in the region. In partnership with governments, regional institutions,

humanitarian and development partners, we are helping communities to minimize exposure, adapt, and recover quickly from inevitable shocks by making sound investments that contribute to resilience. We engage with governments, humanitarian and development partners to convene, discuss key priorities, learn from each other and collaborate on ways to have joint-plans for resilience. engaging partners at the global and regional levels to support country-led plans for resilience.

#### Trade and investments

We work with donors, Development Financial Institutions (DFIs)-such as World Bank and International Finance Corporation (IFC), governments and businesses to increase trade in local, regional, and international markets. We assist governments with trade negotiations, advising and crafting trade policies, expanding access to markets, and

trade promotion. We endeavor to provide innovative financial and investment projects. Our approach focuses on working hand-in-hand with the private sector to identify opportunities that deliver development impact, bring value to the private sector, and position the region for enhanced economic growth.

### Agriculture, Livestock and Fisheries

HACOF addresses widespread food insecurity by focusing on sustainable livelihoods for displaced and returning communities. Our interventions aim to strengthen community resource sharing, promoting peaceful coexistence and reducing conflict over natural resources. We support governments in boosting exports and creating job opportunities in

a region recovering from conflict and disasters. The goal is to enhance food security, household recovery, and community resilience, transitioning from acute phases of food insecurity to sustainable, locally driven livelihoods. This approach aims to reduce reliance on humanitarian assistance and foster long-term development and economic growth.



### **Energy sector**

Recognizing the increasing connectivity to the grid in the region, access to electricity comes with challenges. Private sector energy providers heavily rely on costly diesel generators, contributing to carbon emissions and limiting access to remote areas. There is a growing interest in hybrid systems using solar and wind energy. We assist governments creating policy frameworks to attract private investment in clean energy, enhance energy efficiency, and expand access for regional development. Our interventions bring together technical experts, the private sector, governments to increase access to cleaner and reliable electricity. Focusing on off-grid solutions utilizing solar, wind, and bioenergy, our approach targets vulnerable and remote communities. Implementing low-cost clean energy technology and efficiency solutions contributes to resilient energy systems.

### Public Private Partnerships (PPP)

# Environment and Climate Change

### Climate mitigation

At the forefront of climate action, HACOF will provide technical solutions that aim to incentivize economic actions that are climate sensitive. Our solutions include developing policies, incentives schemes and investment programmes which address all sectors, including energy

generation, transport, buildings, industry, agriculture, water, fisheries and other land use, and waste management. We support governments and agencies to prepare nationally determined contributions (NDCs) and provide technical assistance in its implementation.

### Climate financing

We support governments to secure climate financing from public, private and alternative sources of financing—to support mitigation and adaptation actions that will address climate change. Our principle is based on the fact that the region needs more financial resources to

as it is less endowed and more vulnerable to impacts of climate change. We will tap into the unutilized green climate funds and expand funding sources from existing development partners to finance climate mitigation and adaptation programs.

### **Climate Adaptation**

The region is already subjected to climate variability and extremes including droughts and floods, which have had severe economic and social implications. PCG program supports local governance in Somalia, helping district councils to adopt inclusive decision-making models, more fairly manage resources, deliver results and services for citizens, and—in so doing—increase citizen trust in the councils. The Activity facilitates government dialogue and engagement with citizens to strengthen the social contract, delivers bespoke support to district councils to improve their governance capabilities, and ultimately increase the legitimacy and effectiveness of local government.

HACOF is a sub-contractor of DAI supporting newly formed councils through political advisory, political economy analysis (PEA), capacity building, research and provision of short-term technical assistance (STTAs). The project aims to support district officials to better perform their jobs and ensure that resources and disputes are managed fairly and with citizen participation, avoiding capture by clan groups or elites. PCG also supports them to identify and respond to citizen priorities and become more sustainable by delivering services, collecting revenues, and creating channels for communication with citizens. Combining embedded technical assistance, grants, and construction funds, PCG seeks to expand service delivery to 800,000 citizens.

The objective of the assignment is to enhance the registration intake of the Uni- fied Social Registry (USR) by updating it with the socio-economic information on the 200,000 households supported by the SNHCP project, in accordance with the approved common registration form (CRF).

The scope of the household survey is to collect socio-economic data from a WFP-supplied list of 200,000 households from 893 villages across 28 districts in Somalia and Somaliland. The interviewers will target household heads (as those best placed to provide the household's socio-economic data) to interview. With support from WFP, HACOF's enumeration teams will utilize the existing database with household identification information to undertake respondent identification, mapping, and data collection.
